PE and Sport Premium – 2013/14

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school headteachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. It equates to approximately £8000 plus £5 per pupil of statutory school age. Schools must account for this money and look at how it will impact on the provision of high quality PE and sport in school.

Mousehold Infant and Nursery School is using the money for academic year 2013/14 as follows:

- New PE apparatus/climbing equipment £4,400
- High Quality PE training for teachers £2,700
- PE Advisory support £ 350
- PE resources £ 775
- PE training resources £ 100

Measurement of impact:

- Children will benefit from high quality climbing apparatus and equipment – assessment of children to be done across all year groups by subject leader
- High quality professional development will ensure teachers provide the very highest quality PE lessons – to be monitored by subject leader
- We aim to achieve the PE Subject Leaders Award

Impact of Sport Premium 2013/14

Provision:	Cost:	Impact
New PE apparatus/climbing equipment	£4,400	All of our children from YR to Y2 have better gross motor skills. All have improved agility and co-ordination skills as evidenced by baseline and final observations 2013/14.
High Quality PE training for teachers.	£2,700	2 teachers completed high quality PE training. This has increased skill and confidence in the teaching of PE not only for those who accessed the training directly, but all teachers as a result of cascading training at school. This has impacted on the quality of PE lessons taught to children.
PE Advisory Support	£350	This has enabled us to be prepared for undertaking the High Quality PE Chartermark in 2014/15. This will impact on the quality of PE lessons and provision across the school.
PE Resources	£775	This has impacted on the quality of PE lessons as children have access to better PE equipment.
PE Training Resources	£100	This has enabled training to continue in school time to increase confidence in all areas of PE.

Overall, the number of PE clubs have increased over the year. We hope to further increase these and the numbers of children participating in PE clubs in 2014/15.
