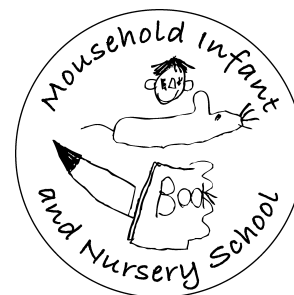

Impact of Pupil Premium 2015/16

All of the children have benefitted from an enriched curriculum throughout the whole year with professionals teaching aspects of Art, Music and Dance (eg: Samba, Ukelele, Capoeira, graphic design.) This has often been the stimulus for imaginative writing and speaking within other aspects of the curriculum and has been evident in their achievement and attainment data. It has also been great to see how it has brought parents and carers into the school to see their children perform. The Samba concert was full to capacity at the end of the Summer Term 2016 and all children in Year 2 made great progress in learning Samba.

Out of the 35 children, 54% of them achieved expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined at the end of Year 2. This is above the National % of 51%.

Out of the 35 children 60% achieved expected standard in Reading at the end of Year 2.

Out of the 35 children 66% achieved expected standard in Writing at the end of Year 2. This is above the National % of 57%

Out of the 35 children 66% achieved expected standard in Writing at the end of Year 2. This is above the National % of 62%.

Part of the Pupil Premium funding has funded a Teaching Assistant in the Reception Year. The outcome of this is that 78% of children in Year R achieved GLD(Good Level of Development.) This is higher than the National % of 69%. 59% of PP children achieved GLD in Year R.

Our clubs have shown an increase in children joining and benefitting from the enrichment they offer:

Spring Term 2016: 38% (27/72) Summer Term 2016: 69% (50/72)

Our Parent Support Advisor has supported many families and the impact of this is that at least 17 families (FSM6) have benefitted from the support and guidance and have engaged with school and their children's learning. Where attendance has been a concern there has been an improvement in attendance in all cases.
